PREFACE



VER SINCE THE PUBLICATION of Virginia Wills and Administrations, 1632-1800—the Virginia genealogists' Bible—in which the compiler, Dr. Clayton Torrence, inadvertently omitted the material still extant in Elizabeth City County, I have been abstracting and compiling the original wills and administrations. In spite of the county being placed in the

column marked "records destroyed," there is a record of some kind in the Clerk's Office for every year from 1688 to 1800. For this present compilation the Deed and Order Books were also examined, but only if a will or administration was proven.

Owing to a personal interest in the county I have collected much additional material from printed sources and have included it here, hoping it will be of service to genealogists and researchers in other parts of the United States who do not have access to printed source material. Unless otherwise stated, printed information has been gleaned from the following sources: The Virginia Magazine of History and Biography, the William and Mary College Quarterly Historical Magazine, Tyler's Quarterly, the Calendar of Virginia State Papers, Journal of the House of Burgesses, and the Council Journals.
