PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of New York

The petition of VIOLET COLLEMAN FURBER KNOWN AS VIOLET WILLOUGHBY, hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:
First, My place of residence is 117 W 137 st (City, town and state)
Second, My occupation is hwt
Third, I was born on the 25 day of Oct, anno Domini 1900, at Barbados, BVI
Fourth, I emigrated to the United States from Barbados on or about the 10 day of June,
anno Domini 1923, and arrived in the United States, at the port of NY on the 29 day of June,
anno Domini 1923, and the vessel Parina (If the vessel arrived elsewhere than by way of the Channel, state name of vessel, and date of arrival.)
Fifth, I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 14th day of June, anno Domini 1923
Sixth, I am single in the DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA Court of USSENT with me USSENT anno Domini 1900
Seventh, I am married. My wife's name is Estace (she) was born on the 30 day of May, anno Domini 1900
at BVI and now resides at BVI (Give number, street, city or town, and State)
I have no children, and the name, date, and place of birth, and place of residence of each of such children as is follows:

Eighth, I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a subject or a holder in the possession of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to the Emperor of Mexico.

Ninth, I am able to speak the English language.
Tenth, I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 29 day of June, anno Domini 1923, and in the State of New York, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 29 day of June, anno Domini 1923, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Eleventh, I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ previously to the 9 day of June, anno Domini 1923, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit: XXXXXXXXXX and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.
