LADY, JACOB			0	Thought to contain grave of Revolutionary soldier, Jacob Laddiman, who arrived in this country in 1777 & in the area following War.
LEE-DODDS			0	It is thought this cemetery was begun by pioneers in a wagon train. Remains active today
LOFTON			0	4 GRAVES: 1185, 1890, 1911, NO STONES
LONE GRAVE			0	Grave of person found in Tennessee River in early 1900s.
LONE TRAVELER-CIRCLE			0	2 persons in their 80s say this cemetery was "old" when they were children. A stranger was found dead on trail and buried where he was found. No date is known at this time.
