| Sulphur Spring Hollow Cemeteries | East of Somerset | Somerset | 42501 | 100 | Freed slaves ended up on small tracts of land in this area. |
| Tilmon Tarter Cemetery | Off S. Hwy. 837 | Ingle | 42536 | 0 | Burial place on the landowner which was one of the early landowners |
