## WILLOUGHBY GENEALOGY-

## **WE HAVE COUSINS**

Our Patriarch William Willoughby was born about 1790 to 1800 in North Carolina. He moved to Smith County Tennessee and is enumerated there in 1820 and 1830 census data. His name is spelled Willoby, Also in Smith County Tennessee in the 1820 census was a widow, Sarah Wiloby, and her family which included two boys. We believe that these boys are the Isaac Willoby who appears in the 1830, 1840 and 1850 Smith County Tennessee census and his brother, Andrew Willoby' who is found in the 1840 and 1850 Smith County Tennessee census.

## DNA TESTING

A Willoughby cousin descended from William Willoughby donated a DNA sample and initial tests were completed in August. A match was found with a descendant of Andrew Willoby which firmly establishes and confirms that we are closely related to the descendants of Andrew and Isaac Willoby. They could be our William's brothers or first cousins. In either case we have hundreds of new cousins.

Tests are planned to see if a DNA link exists between the Willoby lines in Smith County Tennessee and the Willoby lines in Jackson County Tennessee. This huge Willoby line traces to Isaac Willoby who was born in 1750 in North Carolina and died in 1850 at age 100.

DNA has also found a connection to the descendants of Benjamin Willoughby from Yorkshire, England who arrived in the United States about 1880. This appears to be a more distant cousin line.

William Willoughby moved to Illinois after 1835 and was enumerated in the Jefferson County IL 1840 Census. He died March 3, 1843. His wife Rebecca and son in law David Bullock were the administrators of his estate. Rebecca was probably his second wife as she was under 30 in 1840 and there were children in the household 15 to 20 years old. Williams's first wife is unknown as are his parents. His first wife is probably our direct line. The Willoughby family intermarried with the Morgan, Bullock, Nelson and other families of Illinois and there are hundreds of known descendants, all "cousins".
